

Established in 1983 as a local, grass roots response to the increasing problem of child abuse and neglect, Parents Place provides quality family programming as well as child maltreatment prevention services to families that are at risk of or have experienced child abuse and neglect.

At the request of Waukesha County Department of Health & Human Services, the one of a kind Supervised Visitation program was designed to provide children safe access to their parents. Since then, many different enhancements within the Supervised Visitation Program have been incorporated into our service provision including Full, Monitored, Stop/Start, Drop-In, Video-Taped, Emergency In-Home, Educational, Community, Safe Exchanges and In-Home Safety Services.

Parents Place became the official name of the organization in 2013 after 30 years of serving the community as Prevention & Protection of Abused Children. Programs like Healthy Families and the Volunteer Match Program were initially offered with Supervised Visitation to families but since then our programming has expanded tremendously. As Waukesha County's Family Resource Center, we meet the needs of the community today with trauma informed, evidence-based programming within our Community Education Program offerings with parent support groups, education classes and workshops, Born Learning, children's education and support groups, playgroups, the Triple P Program and information and referral.

Parents Place mission is to improve the quality of life for children and families by strengthening families and protecting children through intervention, prevention and ongoing education in Southeastern Wisconsin.

PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

Supervised Visitation

In an effort to reunite families that have been disrupted or maintain family structure, Parents Place provides Supervised Visitation services to children who have been separated from their families in an effort to maintain a relationship with their parent/s while a permanency plan is being formulated. Children and non-custodial parents are able to spend quality time together in a safe and nurturing environment under the guidance of professionally trained staff who provide education, observation, documentation, and intervention, when necessary.

During the past year, Parents Place provided safe visitation services to 117 children and 90 parents with a total of 5,891.5 direct service hours in safe visitation access.

Community Education

Community Education is a resource for families with children ages 0-18 and is designed to promote strong, healthy families through support, education and shared experiences by building on family strengths. All families can benefit from sound parenting and support that can be found in many of our Community Education Program options...
